

DEMOGRAPHICS


Population Pyramid



- Edwards County's population is stable, with the number of young people being roughly equal to the number of adults.
- The number of residents in their 20s and 30s is lower than that of other age groups – meaning that they may have moved away for education or career reasons.

Population Trend



- From 1990 to 2012, Edwards County has lost about 21% of its population (806 residents).
- This may reflect the low number of residents in their 20s and 30s.

- Edwards County is fairly homogeneous, with a majority of residents being non-Hispanic whites.
- People of Hispanic decent make up nearly 20% of the population.

- Edwards county has slightly lower educational attainment compared to Kansas.



- The unemployment rate is similar in both Kansas and Edwards County, however the median household income is greater in Kansas, and the percent in poverty is less in Kansas.
- The percent of people without health insurance is similar between Edwards County and Kansas, but the percent of people with public health insurance is slightly greater in Edwards County.

Leading Causes of Death: 1993 to 2012




- Chronic diseases, especially heart disease and cancer, account for the most deaths in Edwards County.
- Accidents, including motor vehicle accidents, account for the second most deaths in Edwards County.
- Edwards County has statistically significantly greater rates of death from heart disease, motor vehicle accidents, and chronic lower respiratory diseases compared to the State of Kansas.


Interpretation

- 302 individuals completed the survey. This represents 20% of Edwards County's total population, and is considered a large sample.
- Because the sample was selected at convenience, rather than randomly, it is important to observe how it differs from the total population.
 - Women and older individuals were overrepresented.
 - Hispanics were slightly underrepresented, making up roughly 17% of the population, but 7% of the survey respondents.
- This may bias the results of the survey, but because so many individuals completed it, it still conveys important information.

Self Rated Health Status, by Health Insurance



- Self rated health status was best among individuals with private health insurance.
- Individuals without health insurance also rated their health as excellent or very good, but this is likely due to the fact that this is the youngest group.
- Individuals with Medicare provided more negative ratings, but this may be due to the fact that this is the oldest group.
- Individuals with Medicaid had the lowest self rated health.

- Most Edwards County residents completing this survey received primary care in Edwards County (81%)
- Only 3% stated that they had no primary care provider.

- Due to the fact that this is a convenience sample the estimated percentages may not be accurate.
- In addition, some of the questions may be prone to social desirability bias, most notably, the question about substance abuse.
- However, the survey does show that many individuals in Edwards County are living with chronic health conditions.

 Based on percentage, it is noted that Affordable Health Insurance at 30% is the highest health care services needed.




Interpretation

How often do you exercise




Reasons for not exercising, among those reporting not exercising






Chronic Disease



Highest Rated Health Service Needs




Lowest Rated Health Service Needs




Interpretation of the Most Pressing Needs

- Source of Primary Care 18% primary care is obtained outside of Edwards County or do not have a provider.
- Health Conditions Many individuals in Edwards County are living with chronic health conditions.
- Needs to Manage Health Conditions 16% indicated they did not have what they needed to manage their health condition.
- Health Care Services Needed 30% indicated the need for affordable health care insurance.
- Lifestyle/Quality of Life Needs 23% indicated the need of affordable fresh and natural foods.

- Exercise 31% indicated they do not exercise due to lack of motivation.
- Communicable Disease Childhood vaccinations and sexually transmitted infections are noted at the highest percentage.
- Chronic Disease 51% indicated obesity and 47% indicated cancer.
- Highest Rated Health Service Needs 45% indicated no health insurance.
- Lowest Rated Health Service Needs 23% indicated availability of medical equipment.
- Adolescent Health Issues 51% indicated teen alcohol abuse and 40% indicated teen pregnancy.
- Mental Health Issues 32% indicated drug/alcohol abuse and 28% indicated mental health.
